



Yes on National Popular Vote Launches Ballot Effort so the Candidate with the Most Votes Wins and Every Vote Matters.

Former MI Republican and Democratic Party Chairs leading initiative petition effort.

LANSING – September 27, 2021 – Michigan’s bipartisan “**Yes on National Popular Vote**” announced the kickoff of a ballot effort to ensure every Michigan voter will be relevant in every presidential election and restore faith and credibility in our political system.

“We know National Popular Vote is enormously popular with Michigan voters because it means the presidential candidate who earns the most popular votes across all 50 states wins,” said **Mark Brewer**, former Michigan Democratic Party chair. “We are excited to launch our effort to bring this important proposal to let voters, not politicians, determine if Michigan moves our country toward a national popular vote for president.”

National Popular Vote ensures that *every* vote, in *every* state, will matter in *every* presidential election. Regardless of party affiliation, Michiganders favor a national popular vote because it’s the only way to ensure their votes for president will directly affect who wins.

“Michigan should join 15 other states and move this country toward a national popular vote for president,” said **Saul Anuzis**, former Michigan Republican Party chair. “Every person in Michigan who believes in the principle of one person, one vote for presidential elections should join our effort today.”

National Popular Vote legislation has been enacted by 15 states and the District of Columbia. The National Popular Vote will take effect when the participating states represent the 270 electoral votes needed to win the presidency. Michigan has 15 electoral votes.
